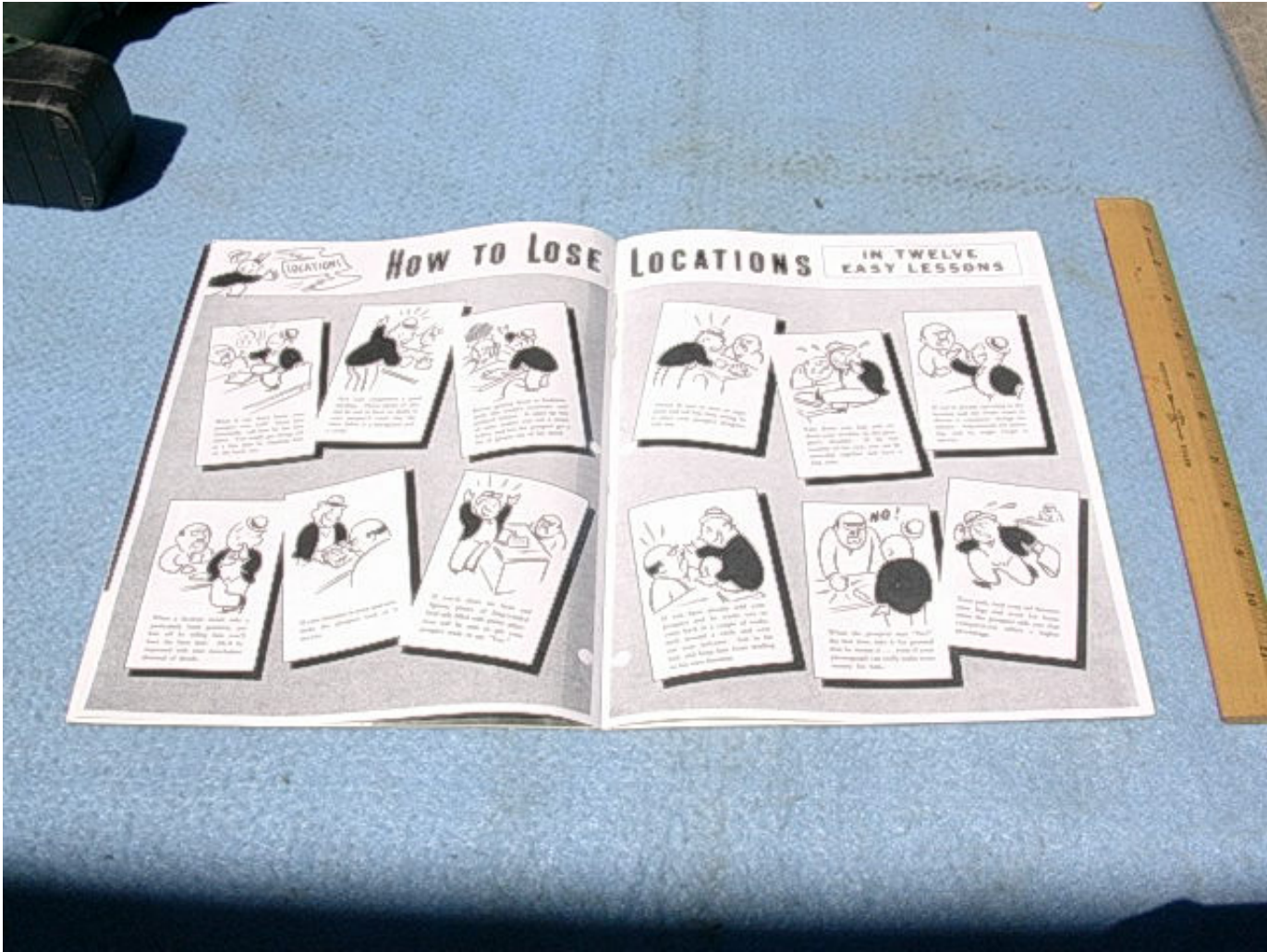


Can You Imagine
